

## **Homework Policies: French 1-2, 3-4, and 5-6**

- ✓ Homework is due (not assigned) on the day for which it is listed.
- ✓ For exercises in the text, you must always copy the example (which is printed in red) and skip lines between each number.  
*Why? Because this helps you understand what to do in a different way than just reading the directions.*
- ✓ In addition, you must always write the original question or statement.  
*Why? Because this helps French sentence structure become natural and instinctive for you. You will make more rapid progress!*
- ✓ For all homework, you must attempt each question even if you feel you do not understand.  
*Why? Because it is in taking risks and making guesses or predictions that you will learn French. Making guesses/predictions improves student learning, whether or not they are right or wrong.*
- ✓ If you have an excused absence from school, you should keep up with your work if you are not ill, but you do have as many days as you were absent to make up the work that you have missed. If you miss class for athletics, student government, or any other school event, you do not have a grace period to make up your work; you need to see me *before* class to turn in your work or obtain an extension.  
*Why? Because homework in foreign language must be done daily and on time in order to build needed skills logically. Each day builds on the day before and getting out of sequence just makes it tougher on you!*
