

Don't Forget to Bring

- Passport!!!**
- Medical Plan ID Card.
- Student ID Card.
- Prescription medication along with xerox copies of any essential prescriptions.
- \$ or means to access \$ and a good safe way to carry it.
 - ATM and credit cards give the best rates and are safe. Travelers' checks are also very safe and reasonably convenient. Please do not carry a lot of cash.
 - You are responsible for buying one meal per day for yourself. Most days, this will be lunch but on some days it will be a quick dinner in our neighborhood. The price of this could range from as little as 6E (a sandwich and a soda for lunch) up to 20E (a sit down dinner) depending on what you select.
- A watch so that when we separate (say in a museum) you are back to the meeting point on time and an alarm clock to make sure you're ready to leave the hotel on time each morning.
 - A cell phone works well for this but you may want to leave your phone at home if it doesn't work internationally.
 - If you will be bringing your phone and it does work internationally, please let me know; we can use this as an emergency contact plan.
- Book, ipod, etc.
 - There are no tvs in our hotel rooms so you'll want something to do in the 2-3 minutes a day when you'll actually be in the room and awake. Also useful for the plane.
- Adapters/converters for any "electrics" or anything that needs charging.
 - Europe uses a different current; for perhaps too much information, see <http://www.enjoy-europe.com/hte/chap11/electric.htm>.
- Rechargeable or lithium batteries for your digital camera if you're bringing one. (Regular batteries get used up really quickly.)
- Umbrella – small that you can carry easily each day.
- Good, warm rain coat or jacket – 40 degrees and raining? Brrrrrrrr.
 - Keep an eye on the 10 day forecast!
- 2 pairs of comfy walking shoes
- 4 outfits, each to be worn twice
- Warm pj's.
- A towel. A towel always comes in handy. Or maybe that's just me.

Then take half the clothes and twice the money.
